Tufi – Papua New Guinea’s Hidden Fjord Paradise

Tucked away in one of Papua New Guinea’s most remote and breathtaking regions, Tufi is a small coastal village at the tip of Cape Nelson in Oro Province. This off-the-beaten-path gem is a dream for divers and adventurers, offering a pristine natural setting where ocean, jungle, and volcanic landscapes collide.

Tufi’s defining feature is its tropical fjords—volcanic inlets unique to PNG. Towering limestone cliffs rise over 150 metres, while calm waters plunge more than 90 metres below. Fringed by rainforest and crystal-clear water, this dramatic backdrop sets the stage for unforgettable diving, kayaking, and cultural exploration.

Perched above the fjords, Tufi Dive Resort blends rustic charm with modern comfort. With panoramic views of both ocean and rainforest, it’s the perfect base for divers and nature lovers alike. The resort offers traditional-style bungalows with en-suite bathrooms, A/C, and private balconies, along with a central lodge, restaurant, bar, pool, dive centre, camera room, and cultural excursions to local villages.

Tufi boasts one of the most diverse dive environments in Papua New Guinea, with consistently warm waters, excellent visibility, and a rich mix of habitats—all within easy reach of the resort: **House Reef Diving** Located just off the jetty, the house reef is teeming with macro life, coral gardens, reef fish, and critters—ideal for check-out dives, night diving, and photographers. **Fjord Diving** The fjords offer calm, sheltered muck diving. Expect to find rare and fascinating species like frogfish, ghost pipefish, pipefish, nudibranchs, and mandarin fish. Great for slow, detailed exploration.

Outer Reef Diving A short boat ride reveals dramatic drop-offs, coral-covered walls, and sea fans that attract turtles, reef sharks, barracuda, pelagics, and schooling fish. Visibility often exceeds 30 metres. **Wreck Diving** Several WWII aircraft and barge wrecks lie nearby, covered in coral and inhabited by schools of fish—offering a unique combination of history and marine life.

With its rare blend of fjords, reefs, wrecks, and rich biodiversity, ***Tufi is a diver’s paradise—wild, remote, and truly unforgettable.***
